The importance of direct visualization:

There are two options:

- A visualized procedure is when the doctor continuously looks inside the uterus as they remove targeted tissue.
- A "blind" procedure is when the doctor cannot see inside the uterus during tissue removal.

Tissue obtained during visualized procedures, like the MyoSure procedure, lead to better quantity and quality samples as compared to blind D&C.^{1,2} A visualized procedure gives confidence that all tissue was removed, and a sufficient sample was collected. This modern and innovative approach to sampling can impact the doctor's ability to diagnose and plan for appropriate treatment.



Here's how it works:4

- Your OBGYN inserts a hysteroscope through your cervix, which allows them to look in your uterus and determine if there is tissue that may need to be removed.
- Your OBGYN inserts the MyoSure tissue removal device through the hysteroscope. This device gently removes the tissue (sometimes polyps or fibroids) and suctions it out of your body.
- 3. The tissue (often called a sample) that is collected is sent to be examined so that you can receive an accurate diagnosis and determine next steps.





A MyoSure procedure might be right for you if:



You experience abnormal uterine bleeding pre- or post-menopause

You have fibroids or polyps that require removal





You experience recurrent miscarriages or infertility and require evaluation


What are uterine fibroids?

Fibroids are noncancerous tumors that grow in the smooth muscle cells of the uterus.⁸ Fibroids can range in size from a sweet pea (0.5 cm) to a watermelon (50 cm.)

Symptoms of uterine fibroids:8

- · Stomach, lower back and pelvic pain
- · Heavy, painful or prolonged periods
- · G.I. issues like gas and constipation
- · Infertility and pregnancy loss
- Stomach protrusionFrequent urination

What are uterine polyps?9

Uterine polyps are small overgrowths of endometrial tissue that resemble finger-like projections or mushrooms.

Symptoms of uterine polyps:9

- · Heavy period bleeding
- · Irregular periods
- · Bleeding after menopause
- Bleeding between periods
- · Infertility
